e was supposed to come to camp last summer, but tragically, Daniel passed away before it could happen. It quickly became apparent that this "relatively quiet, sometimes mischievous young man with a contagious laugh," as his family and friends say, impacted so many in life.

Daniel loved God ... and sports. He was also known for making sure no one was ever excluded and for creating and selling awesome t-shirts, with sayings like "Don't let anyone out work you!"

To honor his legacy and powerful impact, Daniel's family used the money from t-shirt sales and other gifts coming in his memory to send a bus full of kids to KAA this past summer. A total of 48 kids arrived at camp wearing one of Daniel's famous shirts!

Even after his death, Daniel is still changing lives, as many of those 48 experienced Jesus for the first time at KAA ...

Jaliyah was nervous at first, but she loved every minute of camp! She says, "KAA is peaceful, you can be in the worst position of your life, but you will find God here." Ann found healing at camp. She had experienced loss and abandonment at a young age. The devil had her convinced that her circumstances were her fault. God had a good plan for Ann at KAA. Her counselor surrounded her with love, prayer, and biblical truth. Ann shares, "Satan wants you to believe bad things only happen to you because you are a bad person, but God doesn't. He loves you!"

The countdown is on!

KAA is gearing up for one of the *best* summers since the pandemic. More than 2,184 campers have already registered, putting us on track to potentially welcome over 5,500 campers!

We are currently recruiting 500 Christ-centered summer staff to minister, encourage, and pour into campers. The college-age students hired this summer will not only work at KAA but receive discipleship and mentoring. It is a powerful win-win!

Two years ago, we launched KAA Elite, a gospel-centered high school sports team camp. This summer we expect to host more than 150 athletes and 20 coaches. This is a vital ministry to reach unchurched urban youth. 90% of the KAA Elite campers we've welcomed so far were unchurched. More than 75% of these young men responded to the gospel at camp!

The ministry has continued postcamp with one team. KAA Connect coordinator, David Arechiga, is serving as a chaplain for James Madison High School, continuing to pour into and mentor that team. Stay tuned for more news on KAA Elite in the coming year! Even though summer camp '24 is several months away, God continues to move and *change lives*. I had the opportunity to spend a few days in East L.A., with some campers and their Kaleos. This group of kids had a rough go at camp in '23, but God revealed His enduring mercy, which has forever impacted them. You'll read all about it on page 5.

God Ministers to Campers & Staff

They work as cooks, dishwashers, health center staff, counselors, office assistants, boat drivers, challenge course facilitators, specialty coaches, photographers and more ... and they make an incredible impact in the lives of the kids and teens we serve!

Every summer 400-500 students arrive at KAA from colleges and universities across the nation to serve as staff, sacrificing their summer break to minister the love of Jesus to campers.

In the off season, our KAA directors trek to college fairs sharing summer work opportunities. They also utilize Athletes in Action and Fellowship of Christian Athletes to promote summer staff openings. It's long hours on the road and tons of work ... but vital to the ministry of KAA. Campers need exposure to the right role models — young adults living out their faith and pursuing excellence.

Counselors, especially, spend so much time with campers — pouring into them, loving on them, as well as taking care of their daily needs while at camp.

Breasha Powe is one example. She heard about camp through FCA. She loves Jesus and basketball — a perfect combination!

In her freshman year, Breasha started for Mississippi State University's Women's Basketball Team. She jumped when she heard about the chance to share Jesus with kids. Breasha fondly recalls one camper she had in her cabin. Kayla's attitude at the start of the week was bad. By the end ... Kayla did not want to leave. She was reading her Bible faithfully and couldn't wait to share what she learned! Breasha played a direct role in Kayla's "180."

God used Breasha to minister His love and His Word to Kayla and other campers.

God used camp to minister His love and His Word to Breasha, too! She was surrounded with hundreds of young men and women her age who love Jesus. In her words, the experience was "amazing."

"I've grown in consistency," she says. College life is hectic — practice, class, homework, gym workouts. Just like Kayla, at camp Breasha learned the importance of making time for Jesus every day to get in His Word.

Praise God for sending young men and women to minister the love of Jesus to kids, and *praise God* that while they are at camp, they receive ministry, too.

Higher Ground on Mission: Training Tomorrow's Christian Leaders

t was a special summer for our thirdyear Higher Ground (HG) campers! As a culmination to our three-year HG camping experience, focused on servant-leader discipleship, they went on a week-long mission's trip to assist Urban Youth Impact — the only faith-based organization serving the most at-risk inner-city youth in Palm Beach County, Florida — primarily through an award-winning after-school program.

First year HG campers do a deep dive into the Word and go on a local mission trip. Second year campers continue expanding their biblical knowledge, and assist with KAA Connect on the road, and third year HG campers continue learning and take a weeklong mission trip to come alongside another ministry doing Kingdom work in the US.

"The perception is you have to leave the country," explains Jenson Newton, HG Director, "but through HG, we want to show campers various mission opportunities right here."

One of the HG campers pursuing culinary arts used her talents and knowledge in Urban Youth Impact's after-school culinary program.

Another 3rd year HG camper, Grace, says she will never forget the names and faces of the kids she served. The trip even gave her a new outlook on what she wants to do in ministry throughout her life. "This mission trip was like the final exam for HG, but the best final exam I've ever had."

has trained over 4,000 campers from 30 states across the country. Many past graduates have become Summer Staff at KAA and are highly sought after for their integrity and leadership skills.

This past summer, HG officially launched HG Work — an opportunity for HG campers to work paid summer staff positions while still in the program. We want them to experience what servant leadership really looks like in action, learn responsibility and

humility, and discover how to best use their God-given gifts and talents in ministry.

Several HG Work participants used their earnings to offset their individual cost for the West Palm Beach mission.

She loves preparing delicious and nutritious meals. For more than a decade, Mama Stone has closed her salon during the summer to serve in one of the four KAA kitchens.

Mama Frances and her small kitchen staff understand the importance of food ministry during camp and "keep the joy of the Lord present" while preparing the meals.

She and her kitchen crew begin around 5 am each day, making breakfast and prepping for lunch and dinner. Thursday lunch of fried chicken and mashed potatoes is one of the most lauded camp meals. By 9:30 am on Thursdays, they've already fried 250 pieces of chicken!

"Their eyes get big as they're looking to see what's being served. It just blesses my heart!"

General Trass High School's Football Team attended KAA Elite for the second year. Five out of the 22 players made decisions for Christ at camp!

Josh soaked up every minute — from the team building activities, to drills, to tubing, and meeting kids from all over the nation. Pastor Allen "Mac" McFarland



or more than 30 years — Calvary Baptist, helmed by Pastor Allan McFarland, has been sending kids and teens to camp.

In 2003, he joined the Kids Across America Board and has been a member since.

"Serving with KAA has been and still is a privilege," he shares. "God encourages my heart by being in the presence of men and women of God who also serve at KAA."

Pastor "Mac," as he is affectionately referred, is a Bible preaching, teaching, minister of the Word of God. He started his career as a Program Specialist for the federal government. In 1972, while reading Isaiah 52:7, he answered the call to preach the gospel.

With now more than 50 years in ministry, Pastor Mac has impacted the Kingdom in multiple ways ...

He has served on multiple boards, including Liberty University (where he also adjuncts theology courses), Rawlings School of Divinity, KAA, and the Southern Baptist Convention of Virginia. He founded and serves as the chancellor of the Angelos Bible College in Portsmouth.

His contributions to both academia and ministry earned him the distinguished honor of being named among the Nation's 70 Most Influential Black Christian History Makers by Black Christian News Network, alongside noted leaders, such as Dr. Tony Evans, Dr. Ben Carson, and Alveda King.

Pastor McFarland and Doris, his wife of 56 years, have four daughters, one son and 16 grandchildren. KAA is thankful for the godly influence and leadership of Pastor McFarland!

Don't Just Utilize, Maximize!

magine a warehouse full of shelves floor to ceiling stocked with a sundry of items everything from hygiene products to home fixtures, to socks, sheets, and linens.

This past summer, KAA began not just utilizing, but *maximizing* its 12,000 square feet warehouse.

Ninety percent of the inventory in the warehouse has been donated. Last year, camp received over one million dollars' worth of in-kind donations with little out of pocket.

"The first benefit of having this warehouse space is to KAA," says Dave Janke, KAA Director of Support Operations. "Camp is able to put to good use in-kind donated items, such as hot water heaters and hand soap. Then, what isn't needed can be offered to other ministries."

To maximize the space and share products not needed at camp, Kaleos now

have the chance to "shop" in the warehouse for items their ministries back home might need.

Summer staff member, John Charles "JC" Stanley III, helped launch the outreach. His main goal was to set protocols for receiving/pick-up.

"The idea is to not keep items on the shelf very long but to find someone who really needs that specific item in Kingdom ministry and make sure it gets to their hand," JC explains.


In its first year, our warehouse outreach will impact more than 8,000 kids in communities across the US!




A Look Ahead 2024 Budgeted Goals
